NICE Stripped of Power to Ban Life Saving Drugs.

The decision to strip NICE of its powers comes too late for many people who have been refused life-extending cancer drugs and have since died.

The scandal of patients being denied drugs just because the NHS rationing body decides they are too expensive will end, ministers have declared.

In a stunning victory for patients following the campaign by the Daily Mail the controversial organisation NICE will be stripped of its powers to ban drugs on the Health Service.

The current arbitrary limit on the cost of new drugs, around £30,000 per year of extended high quality life will be scrapped from 2014.

The decision will end the ordeal of tens of thousands of patients being denied life extending drugs every year, even though their clinician believes they could help them.

Critics blame decisions by the ‘penny-pinching’ National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence for the UK’s appalling record on cancer survival, which sees patients denied innovative new drugs that are available freely in Europe.

Several decisions by NICE have triggered a series of high profile battles in which it has attracted the anger of patient groups and become a byword for a heartless NHS money above patients lives.

Cancer charities say 20,000 patients die early or needlessly every year because of NICE decisions, the Department of Health now says that NICE would no longer be acting as an arbiter on the availability of drugs with GPs instead deciding what the NHS could afford.

Groups of GPs – consortia – will be responsible for deciding whether a drug should be funded or not. These consortia will be in charge of spending NHS money in their areas after 2013.

Carers are already pushed to the limit and they can't take any more cuts say Carers UK, this is the message Carers UK has been taking to Government in the wake of yet further announcements of massive cuts to council spending and welfare benefits.



Cuts of billions from benefits will also hit disabled and older people and their families will be particularly hard hit.



Carers UK went on to state that whilst an extra £2 billion funding for social care was welcomed, the removal of ring fencing and 26% cuts to local council budgets has led to concerns that the money will not reach hard pressed families. It is vital that local councils make social care a priority.



From 4th January 2011 VAT is set to rise from 17.5% to 20%, pushing up the price of many consumer goods. But there are a number of everyday items that are exempt from this tax, such as most food items, books, newspapers, magazines and children's clothes. The 2.5% VAT increase will apply to items deemed as luxury items by the Government, such as a bar of chocolate a packet of biscuits, a new TV and your favourite tittle, just about everything that isn't a main food item.

The Trading Standards Office are making people aware of the following scam.



A card is posted through your door from a company called PDS (Parcel Delivery Service) suggesting that they were unable to deliver a parcel and that you need to contact them on 0906 6611911 (a Premium rate number). **DO NOT** call this number, as this is a mail scam originating from Belize.

If you call the number and you start to hear a recorded message you will already have been billed £315 for the phone call.

If you do receive a card with these details, then please contact Royal Mail Fraud on 020 7239 6655.
